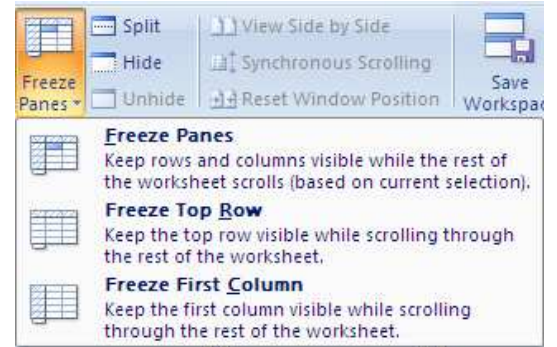


Using the Freeze Panes Function in Excel

Freezing panes allows you to move through a larger worksheet while keeping your reference cells in view.

Step 1: Select the Freeze Panes icon under the “View” tab.

A drop-down will appear with three options.

Step 2a: “Freeze Top Row” will freeze the top row in the current viewing range of the worksheet.

Step 2b: “Freeze First Column” will freeze the first column in the current viewing range of the worksheet.

Step 2c: “Freeze Panes” will freeze whatever rows and/or columns you have previously selected. A black line will separate the rows/columns that have been frozen.

Step 3: To unfreeze panes, select the “Freeze Panes” icon under the View tab, and select the “Unfreeze Panes” option in the drop-down.
